17th Mini Film Festival: Mini In Scale, Big in Ambition

We (gratefully) made it again!

It is the 17th edition of Mini Film Festival, the longest running short film festival in Malaysia. This year, six short films, out of 20 competing in the 17th Mini Film Festival (17thMFF) organized by the Cinematography Programme, Faculty of Applied and Creative Arts (FACA), Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) was bestowed awards in Malaysia's longest-running short film festival reflecting the quality of films received this year.

This record high awards number is unprecedented in the festival's history, as in the past, juries commonly settled at 4 awards with "Best Short Film" and "Special Jury Award" for both Open and Students' Category". Hence a surprise for the organizer and certainly happy news for the winners.

Minimising Subjectivity in Films Judging

In a webinar featuring the 17thMFF's great line up of juries hailed from Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand and Germany a night before the awards announcement on 25 July, the juries collectively agreed that selecting and judging films are bound to subjective choice. However, "juries have to go in line with the festival's objectives and their judgement shall be balanced thorough juries' deliberation and discussion in order to reduce biases", said one of the juries of 17thMFF, Maïke Mia Höhe, a German filmmaker and artistic director of Short Film Festival Hamburg.

Short films are often the door to feature length films. Filmmakers who make feature length films today, likely started their career with short films 5 or 10 years ago. Hence, our objective at this festival is to provide a platform that encourages emerging voices which could potentially spearhead the future of Malaysian cinema one day.

In line with that, six films were awarded while the other two films were honorable mentions during the online awards night. The general impression of the juries was much inclined towards students' films as opined by one of the juries, Ms. Lulu Ratna from Indonesia, "these films are mature, exciting and able to provide experiences to peek into the life and observation of these filmmakers towards themselves and Malaysia per se".

6 Films Awarded, 2 Honourable Mentioned

In the students' category, both "Pulang" (directed by Yam Kin Wai, recently graduated from National Taiwan University of Arts) and "Bagan" (directed by Firdaus Balam, recently graduated from MMU) won the Best Short Film Award. The jury, Ms. Lorna Tee, an experienced producer and festival curator from Malaysia, expressed that the director of "Pulang" shows tremendous maturity and confidence in direction without resorting to any obvious dramatic tricks". Meanwhile, Bernard Chauly, an iconic Malaysian director, told the audiences during the virtual awards night that, "Bagan is a story told in a very unique setting, was a complete film cinematically in term of writing and editing hence it is the joint winner for 17thMFF's Best Short Film (Students' Category)".

The festival also awarded "Were the Sun and the Moon to Meet" by Nadira Ilana, a Sabahan filmmaker with Best Short Film (Open Category). Maiké acknowledged that Nadira understood filmmaking as a wonderful inspiration to reconnect people via storytelling hence the award was given to her and her team.


Three other films were bestowed Special Jury Awards, namely "Burung-Burung" (by Anwar Johari Ho), Ayahku, Dr. G (by Hidayah Hisham) and "Who the F**k Are You" (by Ng Kai Soong). Lastly, two other films were given honorable mention to recognize their efforts in creatively presenting timely subjectmatter, i.e. caretaker of Alzheimer patient during the pandemic ("Menanti Kau Pulang" by Izaq Yuzaini) as well as a film inspired from the folklore of sape ("Echo" by Jeremy Jecky).

The festival had received more than 1250 audience registrations with not less than 7000 viewings from Malaysia and around the globe throughout its festival week, another record for a small festival run entirely online by a group of students and lecturers in UNIMAS.

Despite such a success, internally, the Cinematography Programme continued its commitment organizing Mini Film Festival virtually to celebrate the hard work of our students who have produced their short films throughout the past year. To do so, we hosted a special online award ceremony attended by both current students, alumni and lecturers who observed the ceremony of 14 awards to our students (see picture below).

In retrospect, I feel that this is very encouraging to us as we are running the festival on a small budget and limited students' crew, connected through online communication for the past few months in ensuring a successful festival. Ding Mengshu's design in CFW2022SS

On September 5th 2021, the original designer brand Fantastic Planet released the 2022SS in its collaboration with China Post in China Fashion Week, which is the top fashion event in China.


This show expressed local characteristic from Henan opera, Henan local culture to the innovative design of Chinese traditional Han clothes. According to designer Ding Mengshu, this collection contents of three parts : "the Past, the Present and the Future". First of all, "the Past" part design concentrated on Henan opera culture, Chinese Han costumes culture, bring traditional culture back to the public through modern design. Part two called "the Present", which redesigned and used the logo with a history of 100 years of China Post in the clothing patterns, focusing on tooling style, integrates fashion elements. Finally, "the Future" series' inspiration was concept of time travel, which used glossy fabrics and contrast color to express a sense of future. At the end of this show, three rappers from Henan local brand AMAG created and performed the theme song "Universe Express" for the joint show. This trap integrating Henan dialect and Chinese style elements pushed the atmosphere of the scene to a climax.

Designer Ding Mengshu is a PHD student from UNIMAS, under Dr. Qistina Donna Lee Abdullah and Dr. Salmiah bt Abdul Hamid. By the careful guidance of the tutors, the design works participated in the China Fashion Week made the traditional Chinese costume radiate new vitality. This collection added a lot of modern redesign of traditional Chinese elements, which not only has been widely recognized, but also provided a practical basis for her doctoral research.


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
